Winners announced for 2024 NSW Premier's Literary Awards

The winners of the 2024 NSW Premier's Literary Awards have just been announced with *She is the Earth* by Ali Cobby Eckermann taking out Book of the Year. The outstanding winning works were selected by 32 judges across 12 prize categories from 834 entries.

NSW Minister for Arts John Graham said: "For 45 years now the NSW Premier's Literary Awards — the longest-running state-funded Awards in the country — have celebrated the extraordinary achievements of both established and emerging writers in Australia. On behalf of the NSW Government, I congratulate this year's winners and nominees. Their exceptional work captivates and entertains readers far and wide."

State Librarian Dr Caroline Butler-Bowdon said: "The very best literary works can have the power to deeply touch and resonate with readers throughout their lives. These prestigious Awards, supported by our Government, showcase the finest offerings of the year and I encourage people to seek them out in their local library or book shop."

The NSW Premier's Literary Awards have been administered by the State Library of NSW in association with Create NSW since 2012, and are judged by an independent committee of writers, academics, critics and other sector professionals.

Senior Judge, Dr Bernadette Brennan said: "The judges for this year's awards were unanimous in their praise for and excitement about the breadth, depth and brilliance of contemporary Australian writing. They were thrilled by the ambition of these works, the preparedness, across all categories, of the writers to take risks and to challenge and reimagine established ideas of genre, voice, subject matter and style. These winners offer just a glimpse of the diversity and range of Australian voices telling the stories we all need to hear."

Background notes

- Works nominated for the 2024 NSW Premier's Literary Awards must have been first published, performed or screened between 1 October 2022 and 30 September 2023.
- Writers and illustrators whose works are nominated must be living Australian citizens or persons holding permanent resident status.
- The Awards are judged by an independent committee of writers, academics, critics and other sector professionals. The 2024 judging panel of 32 judges was approved by the government on 21 August 2023.
- Each Award category is judged by a panel of three to five independent judges and assessed in line with the NSW Premier's Literary Awards 2024 Guidelines and the formal judging procedures in place to ensure impartiality.
- A Book of the Year may be chosen by the judging panel from among the winners of the individual prizes, and the Government may, at its discretion, make an additional payment of \$10,000 prize money to the writer of the work so designated.
- Recent Book of the Year winners include: Debra Dank for We Come With This Place (2023), Safdar Ahmed for Still Alive (2022) Ellen van Neerven for Throat (2021), Tara June Winch for The Yield (2020) and Billy Griffiths for Deep Time Dreaming (2019).

- The inaugural NSW Premier's Literary Awards were presented in 1979 by Premier Neville Wran and were the first Premier's literary awards to be offered in Australia.
